How to make THIS paper airplane, our favorite!

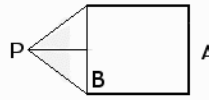


1. Fold paper in half lengthwise (along Line P-A), then fold back out.

- a. The crease in the center is P-A. **Note:** Point “P” is at the edge of the paper.

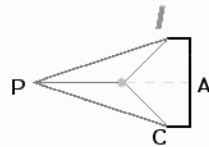
2. Fold point P2 into the middle (Line P2 will line up with Line P-A)

- a. This creates “Folded line P-B” which will be used shortly
b. Repeat with point P1
c. Results should look like this:



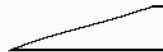
3. Fold both lines “P-B” into the middle along Line P-A.

- a. This creates two folded lines “P-C”.
b. Results should look like this:



4. Fold paper in half along P-A and rotate so the fold is closest to you.

- a. Results should look like this:



5. Fold P-C outward, matching “P-C” to line “P-A”.

- a. Results should look like this:



6. Turn the almost finished airplane over and repeat Step 5.

- a. Results should look like this:



7. Fold the wings out and have LOTS OF FUN!

- a. **NOTE:** When recycling letters about pre-approved credit card as airplanes, it’s a perfect time to teach “credit cards are not free money; you have to pay it back.”
